Councilman Kukle makes a MOTION to hold a Public Hearing on proposed Local Law #4 of 2019 - Temporary Moratorium on the Establishment, Placement and Construction of Commercial Containerized Energy Storage/Battery Facilities Designed for Connecting to the Electric Power Grid in the Town of Hunter at 5:00 PM on December 9, 2019 and a Special Meeting on the same shall follow at 5:15 PM. David Kukle introduces Matthew Perkins and notifies those present that for transparency purposes this gentleman is his nephew.

M. Perkins states that he is here with some questions about the solar project at the landfill, he adds that he has worked on some of the largest solar fields in the world. He is currently living in Boston and is no longer in the solar business but would like to learn what the Town of Hunter wants to achieve at the landfill property.

Councilman Mahoney states that solar has been a goal of the Town Board for many years and adds that the landfill property is ideal for a solar array. He adds that there are environmental benefits and a revenue component. He states that the Town of Hunter would like to lease the solar array to generate revenue. He states that he has received a text from Mark Richardson asking if the Town Board was in a position to reinstate the landfill project due to Public Service Commission changes.

Discussion – M. Perkins feels that the project should be proposed as a commercial off taker approach, a business that can purchase the power to fulfill their own needs. This would be as

opposed to a residential proposal and details that commercial would still benefit the community and the environment.

Councilman Mahoney states that the Town Board appreciates any and all advice that Matt can offer, and they thank him for his efforts.
